Leo Zhao Xuan Liu

Leo Zhao Xuan Liu is a Year 11 student at ACG Parnell College, currently studying piano with Bryan Sayer and Jian Liu. He has achieved success in many local, national, and international competitions, including 1st prize at the 2024 New York Classical Debut Awards, leading to a performance at Carnegie Hall. He won 4th place at the 2023 Lewis Eady National Junior Piano Competition and 1st place in the concerto class at West Auckland PACS (2024) and Tauranga PACS (2023). He has also performed with the Aotea Youth Symphony Orchestra at the Sydney Opera House and with the Nelson Symphony Orchestra. In 2022, Leo was awarded the Trinity LTCL Piano Performance Diploma with distinction. He also plays violin in the school orchestra.

JOHN MIETUS – CONDUCTOR

John Mietus was born in Hong Kong and began learning double bass at the age of four. He earned his Bachelors of Music from the University of Southern California, studying with David Allen Moore, and his Masters at Rice University, working with Paul Ellison and Tim Pitts. While completing his formal training, he also studied conducting with Sharon Lavery and later deepened his appreciation for score study under maestro Larry Rachleff. John served as Music Director of the USC Student Symphony and led numerous film and video game recording sessions at the John Williams Scoring Stage. Currently Associate Principal Bass of the Auckland Philharmonia Orchestra, he has also performed with the Houston Symphony, New World Symphony, Warner Bros. Studio Orchestra, Pacific Music Festival Orchestra, Bay of Plenty Symphonia, Chagrin Valley Studio Orchestra, and the Cleveland Philharmonic. He is honored to make his debut with the Devonport Chamber Orchestra today.

<u>ADJUDICATOR – Yun-Pai Hsu</u>

Yun-Pai Hsu studied at the top ranking American music conservatory, Eastman School of Music and University of Cincinnati, where she received her Bachelors and Masters degrees in Piano performance. There she won several prizes, including the prestigious Concerto Prize. During the final stages of her Doctorate degree, she received a teaching and performance award to work and study at the University of Iowa where she pursued a second Masters degree in Music Theory. Ms Hsu has won many music awards and performed as guest soloist with various orchestras both in the United States and New Zealand. In addition, as a member of the *Center for New Music*, she has been invited to premiere new solo piano works as well as chamber music throughout America and Russia. For over 30 years, Ms Hsu has taught in various musical institutions as well as privately in America, New Zealand, and South Korea. Currently, she has a private piano studio in East Auckland and works as a music specialist at school. In addition, she performs regularly as a collaborative pianist.
